NOTE C - STEWARDSHIP, COMPLIANCE, AND ACCOUNTABILITY

1. Compliance and Accountability

The Town conformed to significant statutory requirements regarding financial administration during the year, except as follows:

NRS 354.626 requires that the Town report expenditures that exceed budgeted appropriations at the function level for the general fund, special revenue funds, and capital projects funds. For the year ended June 30, 2015, the following functions were over expended:

General Fund Health function \$ 3
Parks and Recreation Fund Culture and recreation function \$ 1,651

NOTE D - DETAILED NOTES ON ALL FUNDS

1. Pooled Cash and Investments

Through the Nye County Treasurer, the Town maintains a cash and investment pool that is available for use by all Town funds. The majority of all cash and investments of the Town are included in the cash and investment pool of the Nye County Treasurer. At June 30, 2015, this pool is displayed on the Statement of Net Position and on the governmental funds balance sheet as "Pooled Cash and Investments."

A reconciliation of cash and investments as shown on the Statement of Net Position for the Town follows:

The cash and investment pool is available for use by all funds of the Town. Cash and investments under the custody of the County Treasurer are invested as a pool. The County Treasurer may invest the money of the investment pool in investments which have been authorized as investments by Nevada Revised Statutes. (See Note A7a) The Town has not adopted a formal investment policy that would further limit its investment choices.

Investment gain or loss is apportioned to the Town funds monthly based on the average balance invested for the month.

The fair value of the Town's investment in the Nye County Treasurer's Investment Pool was determined by multiplying the pool's fair value per share factor times the Town's portion of pool balance as of June 30, 2015.

Interest Rate Risk: Interest rate risk is the risk of possible reduction in the value of a security, especially a bond, resulting from the rise in interest rates. Nevada Revised Statutes limits bankers' acceptances to 180 days of maturities, repurchase agreements to 90 days, U.S. Treasuries and Agencies to less than 10 years, and commercial paper to 270 days maturity. The approximate weighted average maturity of investments in the Nye County Treasurer's investment pool was 1.95 years. Detailed information concerning the investment pool is in the annual financial report of Nye County, Nevada.

The Board anticipates no deficiency in the fund balance; and

The fund shall be subject to the following statues: NRS Chapter 354 Local Government Budgets; and NRS Chapter 332 Local Government Purchases Act; and NRS Chapter 350 Debt Management;

The fund shall be subject to an annual independent audit at the same time all county funds are examined; and

Interest earned in the fund shall remain in the fund.

The fund shall be subject to an annual independent audit at the same time all county funds are examined; and

Interest earned in the fund shall remain in the fund.

The Amargosa Valley Town Board at their meeting on November 19, 2015 passed Agenda Item 6c.

For Possible Action – Discussion and Deliberation. Recommendation from Planning Committee to recommend to BOCC regarding Nye County Code Chapter 16.12.020 Minimum Lot size in a Subdivision and 16.20.160 Minimum parcel size.

Code No. 16.12.020

D. For lots proposed within a subdivision map located within Amargosa Valley Basin 230: All lots in a proposed subdivision shall contain a minimum of two and one-half gross acres (2 ½ acres).

Code No. 16.20.160

D. For lots proposed with a Parcel Map located within Amargosa Valley Basin 230: All lots in a proposed Parcel Map application shall contain a minimum of five gross acres (5 acres).

Nye County Code 16.20,190 E.

Shall be left intact with no alterations.

E. Water:

- 1. Adequate Water Supply: The water source shall be adequate to provide a continuous supply that is potable and in no way harmful or dangerous to health. Importation and storage of water is not considered an adequate water supply.
- 2. Water Rights Required: The following shall apply to properties that are being divided pursuant to these regulations and are located within the Amargosa Valley designated basin. (The classification of "designated basin" means that the Nevada state engineer found there was sufficient reason for the basin to be administered in accordance with the provisions relating to designated areas.)
- a. Water Rights: Because of concerns pertaining to water in Nye County, certificated water rights in the amount of two (2) acre-feet for each additional parcel created excluding the existing parcel (i.e., 5 acres divided into 4 parcels requires 6 acre-feet, or 3 new lots x 2 acre-feet per lot) that is four and one-half (4.5) acres gross or under in area shall be relinquished to the Nevada state engineer's office, division of water resources. The costs associated with acquiring the water rights and relinquishments shall be borne by the applicant. This requirement shall be made a condition of approval of a parcel map.
- b. Exception: When a proposed parcel map is located within the boundaries of a water service district and it is the intent of the service district to provide water service, water rights shall be transferred to the district in an amount to be determined by such district.
- F. Sewage: Sewage disposal shall be accomplished utilizing community sewage facilities, or when community facilities are not available, then individual sewage disposal systems (ISDS) will be allowed, provided the state health department finds the property suitable for ISDS use. (Ord. 403, 2011: Ord. 360, 2008)


