SUNSHINE VALLEY SOLAR JOB FAIR

SCHEDULED FOR NOVEMBER 14 AND 15

First Solar, the nation's leading developer of utility scale solar energy projects, will begin construction of the 100 MegaWatt solar energy plant called Sunshine Valley Solar, located near the intersection of Anvil and Powerline Road in Amargosa Valley, at the end of this year.

On November 14, First Solar will host a job fair at the Amargosa Valley Community Center, 821 E. Amargosa Farm Road, from 4:00 – 6:00 pm, and the public is invited to learn more about the project and the job opportunities it will create.

The 12- month construction effort will require hundreds of workers, the majority of which will be the install crews for the structure and modules (post and solar panel installers and electricians). However, the Sunshine Valley team is also looking for security staff, general laborers, heavy equipment and forklift operators, safety technicians, janitorial staff, construction services and more.
